

INDIVIDUALIZED EDUCATION PROGRAM DISTRIBUTION

The Board of Education believes that in order for students with disabilities to receive the full benefit of his/her Individualized Education Program (IEP), individuals responsible for implementing the IEP must, prior to the implementation of the IEP, fully understand the scope of their responsibility and the specific accommodations, modifications and supports to be provided. Therefore, each regular education teacher, special education teacher, related service provider and other service provider who is responsible for the implementation of a student's Individualized Education Program (IEP) shall have electronic access to the IEP prior to its implementation. The Director of Pupil Personnel Services shall ensure that appropriate staff will be informed of his or her responsibility relating to the implementation of the IEP and the specific accommodations, modifications and support that must be provided. The student's IEP shall remain confidential and shall not be released to any other person except in accordance with the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act, and the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act.

All IEP copies must remain in a secured location on school grounds at all times. If IEP copies are transmitted and/or provided electronically, security systems (e.g., password protect a file or folder) must be implemented to prevent unauthorized internal and external access to the student's IEP.
