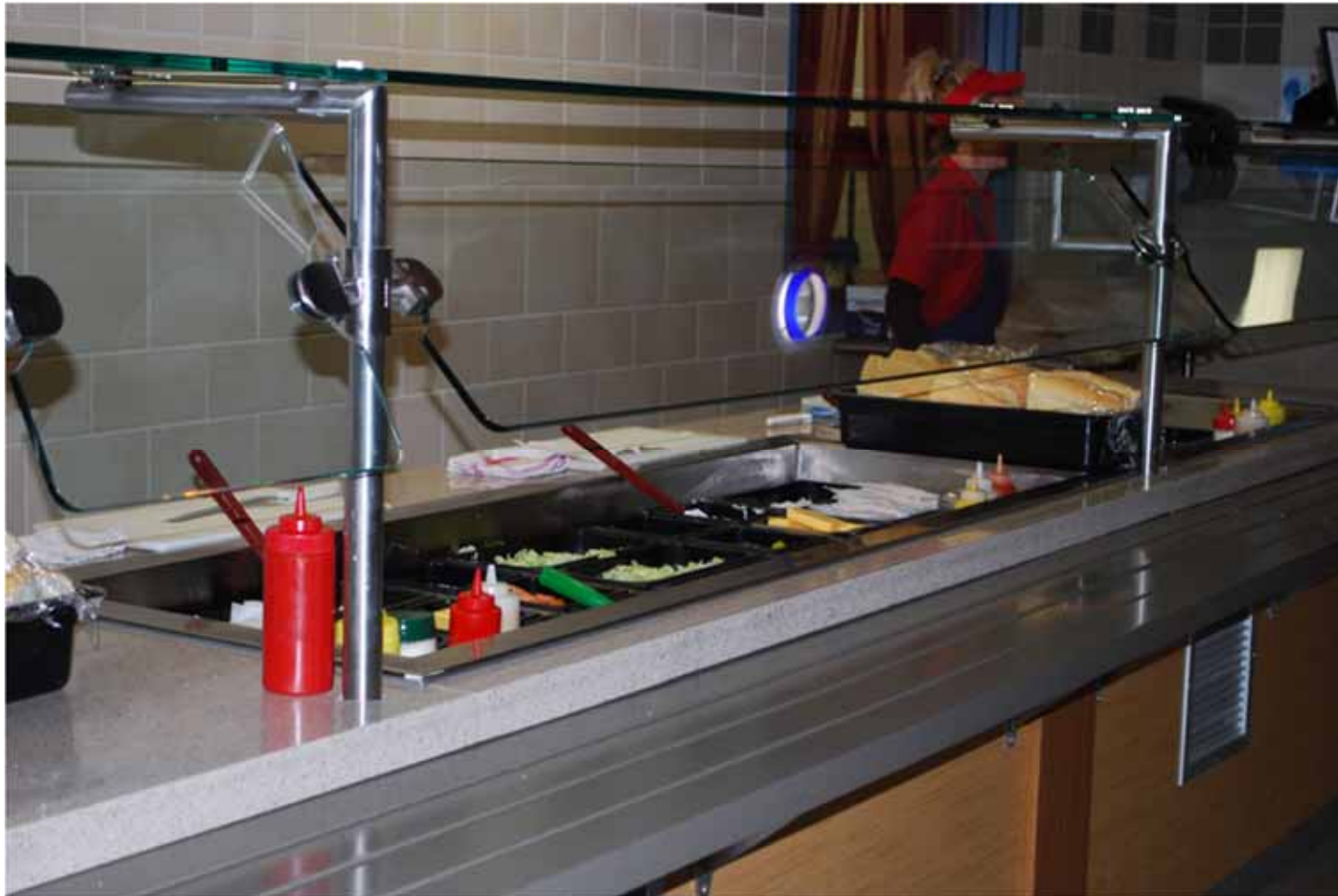

- 7. Professional learning and staff development for all staff that are ongoing, planned, purposeful, and collaboratively developed.**

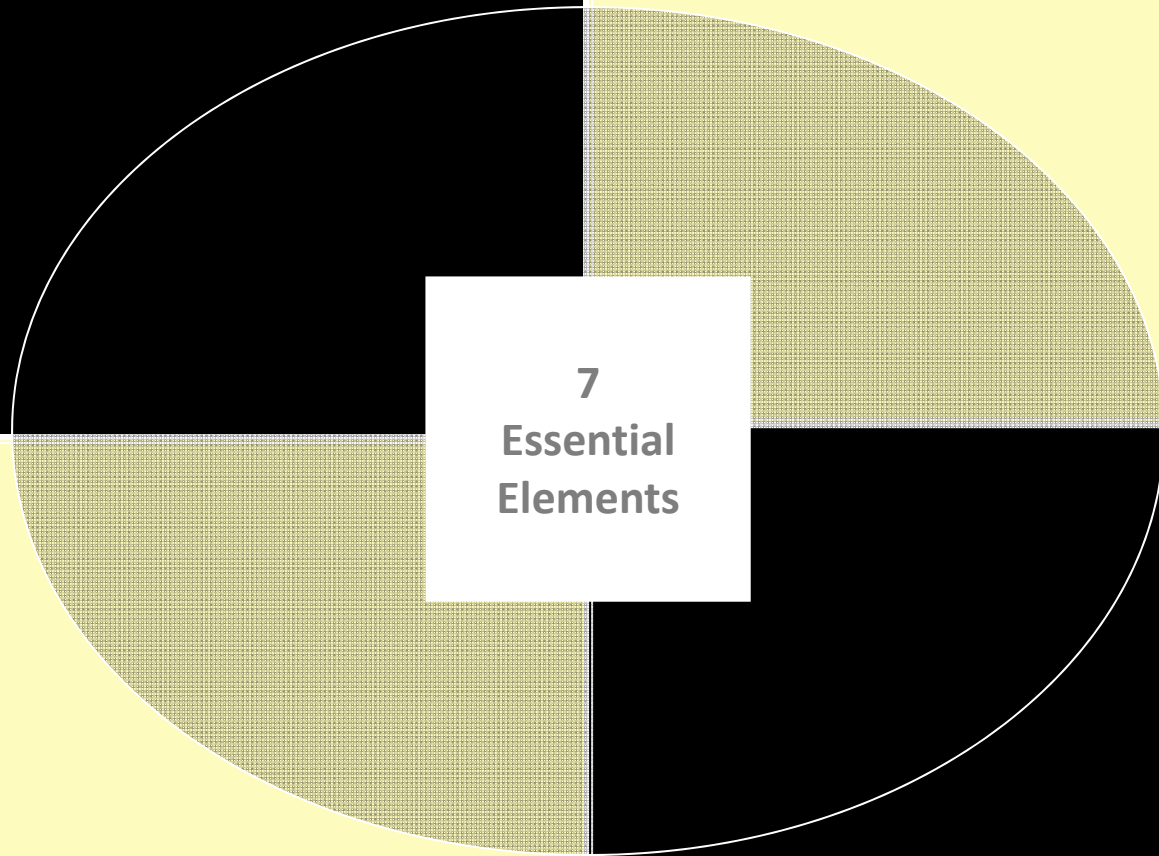
