



High School Learning Center Application Information

Application deadlines are at the end of January, May, and September. Call for exact dates.

A visit to the High School Learning Center at Corning Community College is critical and **required prior to applying**. Call the HSLC to arrange an appointment, and if necessary, transportation. Completed applications with required letters and recommendation forms should be returned to the CPP High School Guidance Office. Completed application packets will be picked up from the CPPHS Guidance Office and reviewed for interview consideration. Please call to arrange a visit for information and help with the application process.

The student will be responsible for:

- Visiting the HSLC
- The High School Learning Center Application form
- A typewritten letter of interest and commitment from the student
- A typewritten letter of support and commitment from a parent or guardian
- A recommendation form or letter from a teacher
- A recommendation form or letter from a guidance counselor or administrator
- An optional letter of support from a past or current employer

The Guidance Office will be responsible for:

- Transcript - including evidence that the student has **passed a NYS Regents exam- 65 or higher**
- Recent report card and summary of attendance records

Applicants who meet the criteria will be contacted to schedule an interview. This school was designed for the student that meets some of the following criteria: (Bold items are mandatory)

- Is failing academically or has dropped out, but wants to earn a Regents Diploma
- Values work experience
- May have social or emotional issues that don't impact ability to maintain employment or attend classes
- May have attendance issues, but is committed to improve
- Is not successful within the existing available program options
- **Is between the ages of 15 and 20 on the date of the application deadline**
- **Is capable of achieving a Regents Diploma AND has passed at least one Regents exam with a 65 or greater**

General Information about the HSLC

- The High School Learning Center is a collaborative endeavor among the Corning-Painted Post School District, Corning Community College, the local business and non-profit community, and local museums to develop a model program to serve capable, yet disconnected students who have not been successful in the traditional high school setting.
- The High School Learning Center schedule consists of a year-round, trimester program in which students will participate in paid employment or a supervised internship in the community for a minimum of 15 hours per week. Students attend academic classes from 2 p.m. until 5 p.m., Monday through Friday.
- Youth from 15 to 20 years old who live in the Corning-Painted Post Area School District and have attended at least one year of classes at Corning-Painted Post High School are eligible to apply to the program. Successful candidates must demonstrate a strong desire to succeed in this non-traditional setting.
- The High School Learning Center provides an integrated academic learning environment with a focus on real world applications. Students, with staff guidance, will create individual learning plans based on New York State Learning Standards. Student participants are expected to:
 1. Earn a New York State Regents High School Diploma.
 2. Develop a plan for the future and the skills to make the plan a reality.
 3. Make healthy personal choices.
 4. Have a commitment to contribute to whatever community they live in.
- The partnership between the Corning-Painted Post School District and local business and industry will help participating students with:
 1. Paid employment in the community or a supervised volunteer position.
 2. A resource mentor at the student's specific worksite to help the student develop the skills, attitudes and habits of a successful employee.
 3. A connection between the student's academic learning and real world applications. In addition, students will be able to earn course credit through workplace activities.
- The partnership between the Corning-Painted Post School District and Corning Community College will provide participating students with the opportunities to:
 1. Utilize the resources and facilities on the campus.
 2. Work toward an academic level that will enable them to take college level courses.
- All staff members are employees of the Corning-Painted Post Area School District.
