

SELECTION OF VALEDICTORIAN AND SALUTATORIAN

The valedictorian shall be that student who has attained the highest scholastic average of the graduating class. The salutatorian shall be that student who has attained the second highest scholastic average of the graduating class. Each average shall be computed at the end of the second (special accommodations due to COVID 19 Health Crisis) marking period of the senior year. Letter grades received from other institutions shall be converted into numerical grades.

In order to be eligible for this recognition, the student must have attended high school in the Corning-Painted Post Area School District for a minimum of two years immediately prior to graduation. A student who intends to graduate in less than four years must declare that intention in writing before the end of the first full week of their last school year.

The weighted average will be the determining factor in the identification of the Valedictorian and Salutatorian.
