Temporary Remote Learning for All Students Attending CPP Schools

Wednesday, October 28-Until Further Notice

Why are we moving to remote instruction?	On October 21, the Governor announced that a portion of Steuben County was placed in a Yellow Zone due to the increase in the COVID infection rate. A factor in the decision to move to 100% remote learning is the capacity to meet the State guidance to COVID test 20% of the district population while we are in the zone. This would require almost 1,100 tests per week, leaving us unable to remain in our hybrid model.
How long will this last?	We will begin remote instruction <u>for all students</u> on Wednesday, October 28. Every 14 days, the state reviews the data to determine which, if any, restrictions can be eased in a focus area. These restrictions will guide when we can return to our hybrid model.
What is our schedule during remote instruction and what do we do to participate?	<p>Cohort C (Students Who Have Been Fully Virtual): Nothing changes for you.</p> <p>Cohorts A and B (Students Who Were Reporting to School Two Days a Week):</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Mon-Tues-Thur-Fri</p> <p>Elementary: Follow their off-site direct instruction schedule.</p> <p>Middle/High: Follow the exact same schedule as we have been.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Wednesdays</p> <p>All buildings follow their regular Wednesday schedule, including scheduled P-T Conferences.</p>
How will students receive their Special Education Services?	We will follow their IEPs and Remote Learning Plans.
How do I access materials?	<p><u>Students with the internet</u> will join their class via Google Meet and utilize Google Classroom.</p> <p><u>Students without reliable internet service</u> will be able to access their materials from our Google Classrooms when they can get to the internet. These students must have contact with the school for attendance purposes. Student Allies will continue to work with families to support students without internet access and make daily point of</p>
